About the Presenters

Monique Leahey Sugimoto

Monique Sugimoto is the archivist and local history librarian with the Palos Verdes Library District (PVLDD), a position she has held since 2012. As manager of the Local History Center, Monique aides the Library's mission of facilitating the preservation of the Peninsula's history by collecting and making accessible materials of historic value on all aspects of Peninsula history, including its ranching and agricultural period, early land development, city formation and its social and cultural history.

Prior to joining PVLDD, Monique was an archivist with the National Archives and Records Administration Riverside field office in Perris. She also worked with the UCLA University Archives; is a frequent contributor to the PV News, writing articles on the history of the Palos Verdes Peninsula; and in Spring 2019, was a lecturer at UCLA Graduate School of Education and Information Studies, teaching a course on records and information resource management.

JonLuc Christensen

JonLuc Christensen is a Records Management Specialist for the Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) on behalf of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) and the California Institute of Technology (Caltech). He specializes in digitization, digital assets management, knowledge capture and management, and user experience design, as well as the management, retention, and disposition of temporary and permanent records. He also provides project management and administrative support to the JPL Archives.

Christensen holds a master's degree in Library and Information Science, and an Advanced Certificate in Digital Assets Management and Services, from San José State University. He also holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in History with a minor in Anthropology from the California State University, Fullerton. JonLuc currently serves as Director-at-Large/Membership Director for the SLA Southern California Chapter Executive Board.

Camille Mathieu

Camille Mathieu is an Information Science Specialist with the Jet Propulsion Laboratory. Her work focuses on organizational knowledge management, including taxonomy development, metadata field standardization, and enterprise content findability tasks. Her current research seeks to understand and model the complementary roles that knowledge workers perform as both the creators and consumers of enterprise content. Camille was a member of the 2017 Institute for Research Design in Librarianship (IRDL) cohort. She holds a master's degree in Library and Information Science from UCLA, and her undergraduate work was in literature with an emphasis in Romanticism.
