








PERCENT (%) OF UNITS WITH A MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE OR DESIGNATED MEMBERSHIP




DID THE UNIT PROVIDE A JOB POSTING SERVICE IN 2018?



DID THE UNIT OFFER A MENTORING SERVICE FOR UNIT MEMBERS DURING 2018?






WHAT TYPES OF PROGRAMS AND EVENTS DID YOUR UNIT HOLD IN 2018?
